To deepen our faith

Over Wallop is a rural parish with people of disparate backgrounds. Our vision sees Christians, regardless of denomination meeting together to worship, pray and support each other, as they grow in Christ. We envisage this happening through:

- † Weekly Sunday worship, in a variety of styles.
- † Worship review.
- † Improved communication.
- † Home Fellowship Groups.
- † Opportunities for deeper learning.
- † Monthly Home Communion for those unable to attend church.
- † Discovering ways in which those with more of a looser connection can be supported in their faith.
- † Valuing the faith of our children and young people and giving them safe spaces in which to explore and develop.

To be a prayerful community

Alongside Sunday morning prayers in church, and those of the fellowship groups, Prayer Groups, our aim is for prayer to become woven into the fabric of community life. We envisage this happening by:

- † Reinstating prayer walks.
- † Offering prayer for individuals alongside main Sunday services.
- † Encouraging people to use our open church for personal prayer.
- † Finding ways for members of our community to make prayer requests.
- † Praying for each other in our daily lives.
- † Being a spiritual focus for cultural events.

Our identity as a worshipping community is reflected in our relationship with the wider Portway and Danebury Team, but especially with our sister church, St Andrew's in Nether Wallop with whom we work and worship together.

Engaging whole-heartedly with our village

On the Sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshipper of God was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple

The church family is already hard working and there may be things that need to be laid down to encourage and release people to better serve the wider community. We envisage this happening by:

- † Supporting local businesses with our custom and community events and organisations with our presence.
- † Maintaining our commitment to the village school and nursing home.
- † Continuing to release funds raised from the church fete.
- † Supporting those who encounter God through baptisms, weddings and funerals and giving them the best experience of being part of a Christian community.
- † Enabling our buildings and open spaces to be an asset to the community.
- † Opening our hearts and homes to be more hospitable.
